TOXIC SHOCK PREVENTION PROGRAM

(formerly known as Period Planners)

We have expanded into more states across the U.S., reaching more than 5,000 women facing housing insecurity to safely care for their menses. In just three years, more than 136,000 menstrual pads/liners, 5,400 packages of cleansing wipes, 5,900 pairs of underwear and 2,800 postpartum pads were distributed through 30 different non-profit partners. 2023 saw the addition of post-partum pads. Now new mothers can safely care for themselves after delivery of their newborn.

LEILA ROSE FOUNDATION

40 families from Marc's home country of Australia have received one-time \$2,500 grants to overcome obstacles in their battle with rare childhood cancer.

NEW IN 2024

The Begin Again Foundation Fund is expanding. We are excited to announce our new partnership with Monash Children's Hospital in Victoria, Australia. We look forward to assisting families with sick children so they can focus on healing and recovery.

The Begin Again Foundation Amputee Fund will launch in early 2024. With 38 amputations a day occurring in the U.S. related to sepsis, we want to help navigate the long and costly road to recovery after an amputation. This fund will provide one-time \$1,000 grants to offset additional expenses like longer rehabilitation and prosthetics.
